Celebrating the 45th Anniversary of the Fair Housing Act

On April 4, 1968, Dr. Martin Luther King was assassinated in a Memphis motel. His death triggered angry and violent responses across the country, but it also opened a door that allowed the passage of the Fair Housing Act. The Act had been stalled in Congress since its introduction in 1967, but Dr. King's death created an opportunity for passage. President Lyndon Johnson applied political pressure on congressional leaders to get the law enacted before Dr. King's funeral. The bill passed both the House and Senate and was signed by President Johnson on April 11th.

The original law prohibited discrimination based on race, color, religion and national origin in any real estate transaction. It has

been twice amended; sex discrimination was prohibited in 1974 and familial status and "handicap" were added as protected classes in 1988.

Prior to the 1988 amendments, HUD lacked the power to aggressively enforce the Act. As a result, most enforcement activity was done through litigation by private civil rights attorneys. The National Fair Housing Alliance, an advocacy group composed of non-profit fair housing groups, issued a report in June 2009 documenting that between 1990 and 2007 alone, private enforcement activities had resulted in over \$275,000,000 in


Nationwide Open House Weekend

Continued from Page 1 court-ordered relief in Fair Housing Act litigation.

The 1988 amendments not only expanded the protections of the law to include families with children and people with disabilities, but it also gave HUD the authority to conduct thorough investigations and to refer meritorious cases to Administrative Law Judges for trial. The Act also allows for cooperation between HUD and states such as Nebraska that have state laws "substantially equivalent" to the federal law.

The enforcement of the Fair Housing Act has been crucial in changing the attitude of society and creating more inclusive communities. We are but 45 years from a time when housing segregation was not only lawful but generally accepted as the norm. Discrimination in all aspects of society, including housing, is far from a resolved issue but there is demonstrable advancement in the idea that all people deserve an equal opportunity to live their lives to the fullest in the security of the home of their choice.

Question: Spring is here. As new homeowners, we are wondering if our home has incurred any wear or damage over the Winter. What do you recommend that we inspect?

Answer: You are wise to be concerned about possible damage to your home. A home's exterior tends to be neglected over the Winter, and Spring is a good time to inspect it. Water is a home's worst enemy, especially to its exterior. I recommend you inspect the following:

- Roof—Have your roof inspected for any loose/ missing/damaged shingles
- Gutters—Clean the gutters and downspouts, make sure they are secured to the house, and make sure there are adequate downspout extensions in place to ensure proper water runoff away from the home.


- Exterior Wood—Inspect the wood on the windows, doors and trim. Replace any damaged wood, and paint and caulk as needed
- Siding—Typical composition board siding or wood siding requires paint approximately every 5 to 7 years. Check your siding for any loose or damaged areas and check the condition of the paint and caulking.
- Grading—The yard along the foundation should slope away from the home. Ideally, a 1"/foot slope for a minimum of 4 feet is recommended. Proper grading helps protect your foundation and helps prevent water seepage in the basement.

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If you have an eKEY, smartphone, you can register a LockBox to a property without ever going into SupraWEB. When you are placing the LockBox on the property and use the 'Open Shackle' feature you need to select a reason.

You have four options;

 Adding on a new listing – Select this option when you are putting the LockBox on a new listing.

You have two options; either select 'Listing ID' or 'Address.' If you choose 'Listing ID' you would enter the MLS number attached to the property in Paragon. If you choose 'Address' you simply enter the *house number only*, for example, '765.' Over the next 72 hours the Supra system and the MLS sync with each other and assign the Lockbox on the listing to the

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Listing ID and address. This is especially helpful when receiving emails about who showed the property. (This process will work as long as you input the listing into the MLS within 72 hours of placing the LockBox on the property.)

- Removing from listing Unassigns the address and Listing ID from this LockBox.
- Relocating on same listing Does nothing.
- *None of the above* Will send you a courtesy email to remind you to register the LockBox.

(If you have an Apple product, you have to click 'Save' in the upper right hand corner of this screen to finish the 'Release Shackle' process.)

Concrete: The Magical Mud

Concrete is an integral part of home construction. Throughout the centuries and in many places still today, people live in mud or earth homes. As society has progressed, our building materials have improved. The ingredients of concrete and correct construction practices ensure that today's magical mud provides all the durability and strength we need.

The capabilities of concrete were mastered long ago by the Romans. The famous Coliseum at the center of Rome was built largely with concrete. After the empire passed and the knowledge of the technology faded, concrete was used very little until it was "re-discovered" in the mid-18th century. Portland cement was patented in 1824. It is a mixture of oxides of calcium, silicon and aluminum.

Portland cement is mixed with aggregate (sand, gravel) and water to create concrete.

The concrete we use today allows our homes to last generations. Without the barriers that concrete provides, most building materials would deteriorate when in contact with the earth. Our homes rest on a footing of concrete. Our foundation walls are concrete block or poured concrete. We park our cars on concrete driveways and walk on concrete sidewalks and steps.

To ensure concrete stands the test of time, the correct preparation and pouring practices are essential. If footings are poured on backfilled earth, they will sink and take the house above it with them. That is why every new home must have a footing inspection prior to the footings being poured. If a builder pours the footings without this inspection the footings have to be pulled out and re-poured. Similarly, the soil must be



properly prepped under any concrete poured on grade, such as basement floors, driveways, and patios to ensure the concrete will not settle in the future.

We all know the complications that can arise if concrete settles. Some can be very expensive, such as having to repair a foundation wall to save the house. Some repairs are more common and less expensive, such as needing to mud jack a concrete sidewalk or driveway to address trip concerns. If proper construction practices are followed and the right mud

is used, concrete can last a magically long time. Just ask the Romans.

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dishonor to the real estate profession. REALTORS® having direct personal knowledge of conduct that may violate the Code of Ethics involving misappropriation of client or customer funds or property, willful discrimination, or fraud resulting in substantial economic harm, bring such matters to the attention of the appropriate Board or Association of REALTORS®. (Amended 1/00)

Realizing that cooperation with other real estate professionals promotes the best interests of those who utilize their services, REALTORS® urge exclusive representation of clients; do not attempt to gain any unfair advantage



over their competitors; and they refrain from making unsolicited comments about other practitioners. In instances where their opinion is sought, or where REALTORS® believe that comment is necessary, their opinion is offered in an objective, professional manner, uninfluenced by any personal motivation or potential advantage or gain.

The term REALTOR® has come to connote competency, fairness, and high integrity resulting from adherence to a lofty ideal of moral conduct in business relations. No inducement of profit and no instruction from clients ever can justify departure from this ideal.

In the interpretation of this obligation, REALTORS® can take no safer guide than that which has been handed down through the centuries, embodied in the Golden Rule, "Whatsoever ye would that others should do to you, do ye even so to them."

Accepting this standard as their own, REALTORS® pledge to observe its spirit in all of their activities whether conducted personally, through associates or others, or via technological means, and to conduct their business in accordance with the tenets set forth below. (Amended 1/07)
