Vinyl Siding Info & Maintenance

Vinyl siding is the most commonly installed exterior cladding for residential construction in the United States and Canada. This siding has low maintenance and does not deteriorate like many other types of siding. However, as with any product exposed to our diverse and sometimes harsh weather it will age and take damage in its own unique ways.

Vinyl siding is more susceptible to hail damage than some other types of siding. In the right hail storm, siding can crack or holes can be created in the siding. Vinyl siding and its metal trim counterparts can come loose in high winds. After strong winds the siding should be evaluated for any damage that might have occurred.

Vinyl is susceptible to heat damage. Cooking grills placed too close (less than 4-5 ft) to siding will quickly damage and warp the siding. Finding damaged siding due to grills is a rather common thing to find in home inspections. There are other times when we will find warped siding in the middle of a wall, many feet from the ground. The culprit here is usually the neighbor's windows. Light reflecting off the glass of the neighbor's window can create enough heat to warp vinyl siding



if the positions and angles are just right.

It is important to keep mulch and dirt away from the siding, to keep insects and moisture away from the wood behind the siding. Finally, be aware that lawn equipment such as weed whips and mowers can damage siding.

When replacing siding, remember that if the siding is newer matching will normally not be of concern. Siding older than 10 years old can be difficult

to match due to fading of the color or availability.



HOW DOES RADON GET INTO HOMES?

For most Americans, the greatest exposure to radon is in their homes, whether those homes are old or new. Radon can get into any type of building—homes, offices and schools—and can climb to high levels if it's trapped indoors. Any home can have a radon problem, whether it has a basement or not, and whether the home has a walkout basement or not.

The indoor air quality of a home can have a huge effect on the health of the people that live in it. If people want to live a healthier, more sustainable life and protect their families from cancer, they should consider learning more about the number one cause of environmentally induced cancer mortality¹. Radon.

TEST. FIX. SAVE A LIFE!

The only way to know if a home has high radon levels is to conduct a Radon test. A qualified, licensed radon measurement professional can do the testing for you, or, (if the home is not in a Real Estate transaction) a home test kit may be used. Reliable do-it-yourself testing devices can be purchased in hardware and home improvement stores or online.

If you find that the home has high levels of radon, fixing it easy — and it doesn't have to be costly. Radon reduction systems (or mitigation systems) will lower radon to a safer level indoors, and they can help improve the overall indoor air quality of the home.

New homes can also be built with Radon Resistant features, as well, which allows for the systems to be hidden in the walls, and ensure the home is safe from the start. "It's inexpensive to build a new home with radon-resistant features. A better home will be both greener for the planet and healthier for your family," said Fuad Reveiz, a member of the National Association of Home Builders.

4) When did you get your real estate license and what inspired you to become a REALTOR®?


I earned my license in March of this year. I decided to become a REALTOR® because of the flexibility in work hours, the ability to


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help people find a home, and to generate extra income to help contribute to raising my children. Also I really enjoy Real Estate and meeting new people.


OABR Coat and Winter Clothing Drive



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

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Supra eKey Functions for iPhone and Droid

We periodically hear from some agents that other agents are having trouble with the eKEY application on their iPhone or Android Smartphone. We get very few calls regarding trouble with the eKEY's, but when we receive a call the problem is almost always solved with a little education. If the system is used as designed, you should have little trouble.



There are a couple of key things to remember when using the eKEY on your Smartphone. The iPhone and the Android have two different processes to open the keybox, if the processes are mixed up you will have difficulty opening any keybox.

ANDROID EKEY PROCESS;

- 1. Tap on the eKEY app
- 2. Tap on 'Obtain Key'
- 3. Enter your four digit PIN #
- 4. Press up on the key container on the BT iBox until the light on the front of the box blinks red.
- 5. The phone does not need to be pointed at the box; it just needs to be within 2 to 3 feet.
- 6. When the phone says 'Successful' you can press up on the key container and release immediately and the key container will fall out of the bottom of the box with the house keys.

IPHONE EKEY PROCESS WITH PLUG-IN ADAPTER

- 1. Tap on the eKEY app
- 2. Tap on 'Obtain Key'

- 3. Enter your four digit PIN #
- 4. Plug the adapter into the bottom of the iPhone and point the adapter at the BT iBox at about 4 to 8 inches from the red oval on the front of the box.
- 5. When the phone says 'Successful' you can press up on the key container and release immediately and the key container will fall out of the bottom of the box with the house keys.

IPHONE EKEY PROCESS WITH KEYFOB WITH GRAY BUTTON

- 1. Tap on the eKEY app
- 2. Tap on 'Obtain Key'
- 3. Enter your four digit PIN #
- 4. Press the gray button on the Key Fob until the light blinks green. Point the opposite end of the ring on the Key Fob 4 to 8 inches from the red oval on the BT iBox.
- 5. When the phone says 'Successful' you can press up on the key container and release immediately and the key container will fall out of the bottom of the box with the house keys.
- 6. If the light on the Key Fob is blinking 'RED' the batteries need to be replaced in the device.

If you make an error and the light on the front of the BT iBox is blinking 'RED' then wait until the light quits blinking and start over using the correct process for your device. If you have any questions or need any assistance with these processes please call 402-619-5566.

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Know the Code

Article 4

REALTORS® shall not acquire an interest in or buy or present offers from themselves, any member of their immediate families, their firms or any member thereof, or any entities in which they have any ownership interest, any real property without making their true position known to the owner or the owner's agent or broker. In selling property they own, or in which they have any interest, REALTORS® shall reveal their ownership or interest in writing to the purchaser or the purchaser's representative. (Amended 1/00)

• Standard of Practice 4-1

For the protection of all parties, the disclosures required by Article 4 shall be in writing and provided by REALTORS® prior to the signing of any contract. (Adopted 2/86)

Article 5

REALTORS® shall not undertake to provide professional services concerning a property or its value where they have a present or contemplated interest unless such interest is specifically disclosed to all affected parties.

Article 6

REALTORS® shall not accept any commission, rebate, or profit on expenditures made for their client, without the client's knowledge and consent.

When recommending real estate products or services (e.g., homeowner's insurance, warranty programs, mortgage financing, title insurance, etc.), REALTORS® shall disclose to the client or customer to whom the recommendation is made any financial benefits or fees, other than real estate referral fees, the REALTOR® or REALTOR®'s firm may receive as a direct result of such recommendation. (Amended 1/99)

• Standard of Practice 6-1


REALTORS® shall not recommend or suggest to a client or a customer the use of services of another organization or business entity in which they have a direct interest without disclosing such interest at the time of the recommendation or suggestion. (Amended 5/88)
