Message from the OABR President

Politics Directly Affect Your Business

I hope everyone had a wonderful holiday season filled with lots of parties, time spent with loved ones, and a reflection of what is truly most important in our lives. Last year was a busy year for REALTORS® in the greater Omaha area. For the third consecutive year, a record number of homes were sold and from a local and state-wide industry perspective we had some big milestones as well. A uniform purchase agreement was introduced (with several revisions thereafter!), the notary requirement on purchase agreements was removed, a Joint Teams Task Force was created to discuss the role of agent-teams in our industry and how they can be better defined, Zillow

syndication was interrupted and then turned back on through a direct feed agreement with the MLS (amazing how we lived without it for 30 days... right?), much of the talk about pocket listings went away (finally!), and so much more, but those were some of the highlights.

Another amazing OABR accomplishment in 2015 was reaching the lofty goal of \$90,000 in RPAC funds. There are a lot of people that worked very hard helping to raise money throughout the year, but our two primary leaders were Bill Swanson and Doug Dohse, co-chairs of the task force. Over the last few years the bar has been raised significantly, yet Bill and Doug continue to do a tremendous job creatively raising the funds necessary.

I would also like to recognize all members that donated throughout the year. It is their contributions that help us elect REALTOR®-friendly candidates that support real property rights and issues important to REALTOR® members on the local, state, and national level.

As we turn the page into 2016, the Nebraska REALTORS® Association will host Legislative Days in Lincoln. In January the state Governmental Affairs Committee will review all legislation proposed in the 2016 Nebraska Legislature that affects our industry. The Committee will make recommendations and from there an official position will be adopted by the Board of Directors. Through the State Governmental Affairs Director and our paid lobbyist, we will promote positions beneficial to you and the industry. This is really where you start to see how RPAC dollars work to open doors for the interests of REALTORS®.

Last year, with the election of REALTOR® Joni Craighead to the State Legislature, we were able to revise the law and eliminate the need for notarization on purchase agreements. This was introduced as a priority by Sen. Craighead, and despite some opposition from others the bill was passed unanimously out of committee and later became law. This is the power of your RPAC dollars.

2016 will be a key political year for local, state, and national elections and I encourage members not supporting RPAC to consider a contribution. Remember that RPAC funds go to specifically support REALTOR®-friendly candidates, not candidates associated with a particular political party.

A number of issues will be monitored this year including legislation concerning agentteams that will be introduced as the result of the collaboration between the Nebraska REALTORS® Association and the Nebraska Real Estate Commission. I encourage everyone to help our industry by doing their part donating to RPAC, getting involved, or both.

I wish everyone much success in the upcoming year!

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Home Emergency Tips Water Damage

DO	DON'T
Remove as much excess water as possible by mopping and blotting	Leave wet fabrics in place; dry as soon as possible. Hang furs and leather goods to dry separately at room temperature
Wipe Excess water from wood furniture after removal of lamps and table top items	Leave books, magazines or other colored items on wet carpets or floors
Remove and prop wet upholstery and pillow cushions for even drying	Use your household vacuum to remove water
Turn air conditioning on for maximum drying in summer	Use TVs or other household appliances while standing on wet carpets or floors, especially not on wet concrete floors
Remove Oriental rugs or other colored rugs from wet wall to wall carpeting	Turn on ceiling fixtures if ceiling is wet and keep out of rooms where ceilings are sagging from retained water
Remove valuable paintings and art objects to a safe dry place	
Open and place luggage in sunlight to dry, if possible	
Gather loose items, toys, etc. from floors

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

SOCIAL EVENTS

- Over 250 members attended UNO Mavericks Hockey Night. Raffle tickets were sold to win a signed hockey stick.
 All proceeds were donated to Rebuilding Together Omaha.
- An **RPAC Appreciation Party** was held in February at The Funny Bone Comedy Club. Over 100 members and guests attended this first-ever event. RPAC was able to raise over \$7,800 from everyone's generous investments.
- The **17th Annual Chili Cook-Off** was one of the biggest yet, with over 250 in attendance. Over \$6,270 in cash donations and 18,500 pounds of food was collected for the Food Bank of the Heartland.
- June was the second annual **Member Day at the Zoo**. During a hamburger/hot dog lunch, several animals and their keepers paid the guests a visit, thanks to the Affiliate member sponsors. Nearly 300 members and guests attended.
- In late July on the banks of the Platte River, over 200 REALTORS®, Affiliates, and their families enjoyed barbeque, listening to the blues, and airboat rides. This **BBQ at The Beach** event was definitely a fun-filled party.
- The **OABR Annual Picnic** was held in August. Forty Affiliate sponsors had exhibition booths in the OABR parking lot. Over 200 members visited the booths and were eligible to win one of 40 gas cards. A delicious BBQ lunch was served for all.
- The **8th Annual Putt Putt Golf Tournament** at Pacific Springs Golf Club was a hit, despite the rainy conditions that day! All proceeds from the event benefited Rebuilding Together Omaha. Each hole had creative and unique games for prizes. Participants and other members met afterward at Fernando's for a reception.
- The **6th Annual Winter Coat & Clothing Drive** was held during the month of September. All of the clothing items were donated to Project Wee Care, Omaha Schools Foundation, Stephen Center, and the Heartland Family Services.
- The year ended with **REALTOR® Ring Day** in December. In 2015 REALTORS® and Affiliates collected more money for this event than any other organization. This year, our organization was able to raise \$9,266, breaking our record in 2014. A reception was held at Fox and Hound for food, fun, and networking.

YOUNG PROFESSIONALS NETWORK - YPN

- YPN hosted their **Third Annual Bingo Night** at DJ'S Dugout in March. There were nearly 100 attendees with a grand prize winner of a \$100 gift card. The event raised \$1,250 for Project Wee Care for the 2015 holiday season.
- In April, YPN hosted the **Pre-REBar Camp Social Hour,** a kick-off to REBarCampOmaha, at the Dubliner Pub.
- YPN sponsored an animal at the **OABR Member Day at the Zoo** in June. These were opportunities to network with other REALTORS® and Affiliate members in a more casual setting.
- In October, YPN hosted an event at Bushwacker's. With a \$10 donation at the door, YPN was able to raise \$535. All proceeds went to Project Wee Care.
- YPN co-hosted the **REALTOR® Ring Day reception** in December with the Social Events Forum at Fox and Hound. It was another great opportunity to network with fellow members, socialize, and share ideas.
- YPN was able to donate \$1,835 to Project Wee Care for the 2015 holiday season. YPN members also donated time on **Distribution Day for Project Wee Care** on December 12. In 2014, Project Wee Care helped 243 families, with 668 children and 366 parents, care givers, and older siblings. In addition to the gifts, families were provided with a turkey, ground beef, apples, cheese, and potatoes to supplement all the non-perishable food that was donated.











MLS

- In May, a new required field, 'Bedrooms Above Grade', was added to the Residential property type. In addition, the colored price change arrows were added to Paragon.
- A direct feed with Zillow Group was established in June to assist brokers who wish to display their listings on Zillow and Trulia. Each broker was given the opportunity to opt-in their firm's active listings to the direct feed.
- In October, Assume Identity was turned on in Paragon for brokers, managers, and administrative staff. This feature allows brokers, managers, and administrative staff to assist agents with printing flyers, updating preferences, adding photos, etc. without having to use the agent's credentials in Paragon.
- The requirement to populate 'Block Number' for all listings was removed in November. In addition, a number of fields became 'required' fields in the Residential Rental property type.
- The uniform purchase agreement first introduced in 2014 continues to be updated and improved to reflect changes in notary law, SID disclosures, and TRID

GOVERNMENTAL AFFAIRS

- Mayor **Jean Stothert** visited the OABR office for a Face the REALTORS® forum, speaking on issues important to the City of Omaha.
- Congressman **Brad Ashford** visited the OABR office for a Face the REALTORS® forum, covering topics important to the industry and recent events
- In December the **RPAC Fundraising Task Force surpassed their goal \$90,000.** This was a huge accomplishment for OABR. From the money that was raised, 70% stays at the local and state levent to support candidates that support REALTOR® issues, regardless of their policital party.

 Omaha.
- The **Annual Golf Outing Hosted by the Affiliates** was held at Oak Hills Country Club on August 24. A total of 148 golfers participated and enjoyed the beautiful weather.
- The **Affiliate Toys for Tots 2015 Turkey Bowl** was held at The MARK on November 4. The event brought in over \$9,000, 400 toys, and 275 stocking stuffers. A special thank you to all who sponsored the event and to those who donated toys and cash for Toys for Tots. The event continues to be second, only to the Husker Game Day Event, for the most donations collected by the Marines. Ninty-seven percent of all donations are distributed in Nebraska.

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

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Water in the Basement Often a Matter of Grade

If you have ever had water leak into you basement, it can be a frustrating experience. Of course, it normally only becomes apparent during heavy rains, which probably means there is not much that can be done until the rain stops. In the meantime, water flows across your basement floor to the lowest spot. If the basement is finished, this could lead to a lot of damaged drywall and carpeting.

More than likely, it is a matter of improper grading due to natural erosion over time. If you recently moved in, you are probably wondering if this has happened before. This is a good question that can only be answered by removing the drywall and/or carpet to check the foundation and floor. Not only does a wet basement smell bad, it also can lead to many more problems including mold growth and wood damage.


What can you do to ensure that your basement stay dry during rainstorms? The most important thing to do is stop the water from ever reaching the foundation. This is accomplished in several ways.

First, check that your gutters and down-

spout extensions expel water from the roof at least 4-5 feet from the foundation. Also confirm that your gutters are not clogged, or the water will overflow straight down.

Avoid using splash blocks, which are the metal or concrete trays under the downspouts. This type of extension will not carry the water at least 5' away and often settle towards the foundation over time, draining water back to the house.

The next thing we need to do is improve the grading along the foundation, making sure it is sloping away from the home. A proper slope of grade is 1" per foot, for at least 5' from foundation on all sides. Since soil naturally erodes over time, you can fix the grade by adding dirt against the foundation, and gradually sloping away. Be careful not to raise the grade so it touches the siding, which can lead to pest infestation and premature wood rot. There should be a minimum of at least 2" below the siding for landscape material, with 6-8" being the preferred distance under grass areas. You need to make sure you are using dirt to slope the grade away, and not mulch or gravel. Water will flow right through these landscaping materials, so we need to make sure the dirt underneath this



material is sloped properly, especially under all planter boxes next to foundation. This type of maintenance is generally less than a few hundred dollars at most, and can be done in a day.

Some basements are equipped with a sump pit/pump combination. This is usually a black pit under the basement floor that has an external draintile system along the foundation footings which dumps its water into the pit. When enough water reaches the pit, the pump will activate and send the water back outside through a type of piping system at least 5' from foundation. It is a good idea to periodically check the pump motor to make sure it is working properly. Another good maintenance tip is to use a

water alarm inside the pit to help keep tabs on the pump



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
